

## HDIBC AGM, 20 MARCH 2020 REPORT ON MEMBERSHIP

### 1. MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS

The table shows the total numbers of members at the date of the AGM, compared with the position at the end of 2018. The main points to note are:

- sadly, 10 members have died during this period
- the reduction of 63 out of 330 playing members is a sharp decline.
- this reduction has been partially countered by the recruitment of 22 new playing members, a notable achievement for which the club is indebted to Trevor Clark.
- it should be noted, however, that 12 of the new members who joined in 2018/19 did not renew their membership for a second year. This is a disappointing development and highlights the importance of getting new members fully involved and committed to the club as soon as possible.
- a total of 26 members were “timed out” and removed from the list at the end of October, having not renewed their subscriptions for three months beyond the deadline of the end of July.
